Mark your Calendar for Tuesday, July 8, 7:30 AM to 5:30 PM

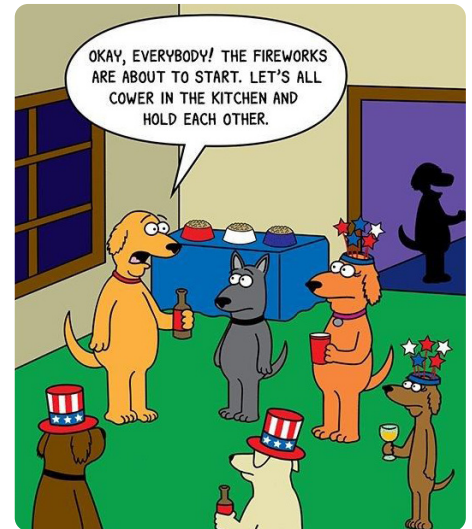
