Steve was Music and Worship Pastor at WFBC for 8 ½ years, after which they joined Brentwood. He has occasionally helped out in music worship by



serving on praise teams and directing choirs at other BBC campuses.

Steve and Kathy met at the close of his final performance of the lead role in Belmont University's "Lil Abner" in 1971. This October they will celebrate 49 years of Christian marriage.
